Joe's Prose News from St Joseph's Church February 2020

Do not be conformed to this world but be transformed by the renewal of your mind.' (Romans 12:2)



If our faith is to be worth anything, it must surely show itself in the way that we live. Paul challenges us to be different from the world around us. As God's people, we strive to live by God's standards, not in conformity to the world around us.

As a disciple of Jesus Christ, we are urged to learn from him, and then put his lessons into practice in our lives. Jesus said: 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul and all your mind, and you shall love your neighbour as yourself.'

A disciple loves God

- with an undivided heart (You shall have no other god but me.)
- by worshipping Him (giving God his rightful 'worth'.
- by living according to His commandments.

A disciple loves his neighbour

- by respecting other people ('Honour your mother and father')
- by cultivating the fruit of the Spirit in our lives love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, self-control. (Gal 5:22)
- by respecting life and the environment (all life is given by God and is precious to God).
- by being self-controlled, remembering to give as well as to take, and serving those around us.

May we always strive to live as God's people.

Have you been Confirmed?

Confirmation is the sign of full, adult membership of the church family. It is an occasion when you renew the promises that were made at your baptism, when the Bishop lays hands on your head, and quite literally 'confirms' you in the faith that you have. It follows a short period of preparation, and is available for anyone who would like to make a full commitment to their faith, and membership of God's family.

You are welcome to join our regular, weekly worship in church:

Sunday: every Sunday at 9.00am and 10.30am. Our 9.00am service is taken from the Common Worship Prayer Book, with hymns. Holy Communion on the 1st and 3rd Sunday each month.

Our 10.30am service is less structured, family orientated, with worship group and children's groups. Communion is the 2nd Sunday each month.

Every Wednesday at 11.30am: we have a short service of Holy Communion.

Prayer ministry is always available after the 10.30am service. If you would like to ask for prayer for any reason, please go to the front of the church, and someone will be pleased to pray with you.



Wednesday at 7am: Morning Prayer at St Joseph's. Come and join.

More: More of Jesus - More of our commitment to follow Jesus. This monthly service for our whole parish, begins at 6.30pm, and will be held on February 16th, at St Joseph's.
